Protecting Gatineau Park for Future Generations

Pauline, a Wakefield resident, supports my efforts to have Gatineau Park recognized as an official park with enhanced legal protection. Like many citizens, she wants future generations to be able to enjoy its magnificent trails.

Due to the prorogation of Parliament, Bill S-289, introduced in the Senate in October 2024, could not be adopted. During the next parliamentary session, I commit, along with Senator Rosa Galvez, to reintroduce this important bill in order to strengthen protection of the park for generations to come.





The Achievements of Our Government for a Better Future

During my meeting with Paula in Wakefield, she emphasized the importance of reminding residents of our riding about our achievements that are sometimes overlooked. At a time when Prime Minister Trudeau has announced his resignation, I would like to highlight the progress our Liberal team has made to improve our quality of life and ensure a better future:

- Significant progress in reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples, with historical financial commitments and the Indigenous Guardians program.
- Major investments in renewable energy and green infrastructure, with a goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 40 to 45% by 2030.
- \$900 million for Quebec, supporting 300 new housing units in the Outaouais and tax credits for home ownership.
- The creation of the Canada Child Benefit, support for families through the Canada Dental Care Plan, and increased benefits for seniors.

These accomplishments reflect our commitment to a more equitable and sustainable society.

Alexandre, a young man from Masham, is concerned about the Conservative Party's lack of a plan to protect the environment and fight climate change. He believes that we are the first generation to feel the full impacts of climate change, and the last to be able to act.

He supports my contribution to the Kidjimaninan project in the Outaouais region, led by Kitigan Zibi, which aims to protect 30% of the territory by 2030 and has received \$2 million in funding from Environment and Climate Change Canada.

I will continue to carry your voice and to be actively engaged in building a green and prosperous economy.
